Roedd tad Stephen Salisbury, Max, wedi ymfudo o Wlad Pwyl yn fachgen 12 oed, er mwyn osgoi cael ei orfodi i ymuno â byddin Rwsia. Ymsefydlodd yng Nglasgow, gan gael ei gymryd i mewn gan berthnasau. Priododd yn ddiweddarach a chafodd bedwar mab, ac roedd Stephen yn ail ohonynt.

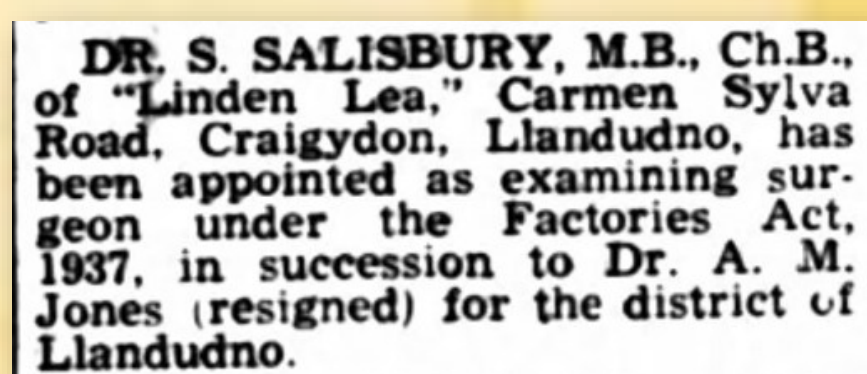
Uchelgais Stephen oedd bod yn feddyg. Pan oedd yn 13 oed, bu farw ei fam, gan adael ei dad i fagu ei feibion ar ei ben ei hun. Gadawodd ei frodyr yr ysgol a gweithio er mwyn i Stephen allu mynd ymlaen i fynychu ysgol feddygol.

Ym 1942, mynychodd Stephen ysgol Meddygaeth Drofannol yn Lerpwl. Tra yno cyfarfu â Judith, ac ar ôl dychwelyd o wasanaeth milwrol yn Affrica priodasant. Treulion nhw eu mis mêl yn Llandudno ac aros gyda modryb Stephen, Leah Lazar, a oedd â thŷ gwestai lldewig.

Syrthiasant mewn cariad â Llandudno a phenderfynasant ymgartrefu yno. Prynodd Stephen bractis meddygol, gan ymuno ag Arthur Madoc Jones. Yn ddiweddarach ymunodd â'r Dr Roy Smith a'r Dr Cecil Conyngham. Roedd ei feddygfa ynghlwm wrth gartref y teulu ar gornel Ffordd Carmen Sylva a Rhodfa Mostyn. Arhoson nhw yn Llandudno tan 1975, pan symudon nhw i Lerpwl i fod yn agos at eu teulu. Bu farw Stephen yn 2000.

Stephen Salisbury's father, Max, had emigrated from Poland as a boy of 12, to avoid being conscripted into the Russian army. He settled in Glasgow, taken in by kinsmen. He later married and had four sons, of whom Stephen was the second.

Stephen's ambition was to become a doctor. When he was 13, his mother died, leaving his father to raise his sons alone. His brothers left school and worked so that Stephen could go on to attend medical school.

In 1942, Stephen attended the school of Tropical Medicine in Liverpool. While there he met Judith, and on his return from military service in Africa they married. They honeymooned in Llandudno and stayed with Stephen's aunt Leah Lazar, who had a Jewish guest house.

They fell in love with Llandudno and decided to settle there. Stephen bought into a medical practice, joining Arthur Madoc Jones. He later joined Drs Roy Smith and Cecil Conyngham. His surgery was attached to the family home on the corner of Carmen Sylva Road and Mostyn Avenue. They stayed in Llandudno until 1975, when they moved to Liverpool to be near their family. Stephen died in 2000.



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
